


SLS World Book Day Competition

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

Using the Genre Pack with Accelerated Reader

To help pupils select a book for content rather that skill level create a genre area within AR using baskets.



Don't forget that subscribing schools can request an adviser visit to help you get organised.

Ideas for using the Genre Pack to promote wider reading

Make a display to highlight a genre

➤ Give the display a catchy title; step back in time, dive into an adventure, read for a laugh, mysteries to keep you guessing etc.

➤ Photocopy the books you choose to display and attach these to bookstands so that they can be borrowed and returned. At the end of the display these can be made into a theme shaped collage as a reminder.

- Make the display interactive;
 - Encourage pupils to add books they have just finished and would like to recommend
 - Invite pupils to add their recommendations by post-it note.
 - Invite pupils to add suitable vocabulary they have learnt or can find; terrified and shudder for spooky books, giggle and guffaw for funny books. Provide a box with paper shapes and a pen.



Hand out bookmarks each month to promote and explain the genre.





More ideas for using the Genre Pack to promote wider reading


- Organise linked drawing, poetry or writing competitions.
- Link to an existing book club or encourage older pupils to start a book club
- Link to a library club with themed games; treasure hunts for adventure,
 Junior Cluedo for crime and mystery, lots of games have animal themes.

Further ideas to promote wider reading across the school

- The 10 minute read.
- 5 books in 5 minutes.
- Check your reading aloud framework or reading spine.
- Check your library stock.
- Boost your collection where it is needed and check that teachers are requesting from a wide range of genre.
- Organise your own reading roundabout or booknic.
